#### Why is our mission to share the Gospel?

In Jesus' famous sermon on the mount, he talked with the crowds about treasure, too. He understood the heart of man that sees his worth in his physical wealth. Instead, he admonishes them to store up heavenly treasures where "moth nor rust destroys, and where thieves do not break in or steal" (Matthew 6:20).

Why do we bring our ministry to refugee camps?
